Restoration Works at the Old Station

There are some major renovation works about to start at the Old Station in the next few months. The Highland Museum of Childhood Trust has secured funding to repair the canopy which covers the platform area. Most of the work will be to restore it to as near its original state as possible but also to carry out essential maintenance works.

Part of the project will also be to research the history of the station and gather factual information alongside people's stories and memories. The information will then be used to create display panels which will be situated on the exterior walls of the museum and also available in a leaflet for visitors and tourists. Susan from ARCH Highland will be delivering a programme of workshops starting on 17th February.

Participants will be trained in how to carry out research as well as how to set up a blog and update the museum's website with historical information about the station and railway. Dingwall Academy 3rd year art pupils will also be working on a design project inspired by the canopy and station later on in the year. Curator and manager Alison Boyle says: "It's fantastic that we have all our funding in place as even to the untrained eye you can see that the canopy is needing quite a bit of TLC! I'm also excited about finding out more about the history of the station and railway. We get many queries from our visitors about the railway. To have display panels and a leaflet will be a great advantage as will a new website and blog. We're hoping it will encourage more people to the visit the village."

Information about when the works will start will be on the museum's website www.highlandmuseumofchildhood.org.uk and Facebook page. The project is funded by Museums Galleries Scotland and the Heritage Lottery Fund. Anyone interested in taking part in the workshops please contact ARCH Highland on 077888 35466.



Science Festival

This year's Science Festival held at Strathpeffer Community Centre is all about "Exploring Waterways and Seas". Held on Saturday 19th March 10.00am - 2.00pm, this FREE community event is a great day out for adults and children alike.

Find out everything there is to know about our rivers, canals and seas. Find out what grows underwater, learn about the dolphins that visit our shores. Learn about the engineering behind the canals and harbours and why flooding is much more common and what we are doing about it. Why do we have tides? How can salmon live in both fresh water and sea water? These questions and more will be answered during the festival.

Exploring our Waterways and Seas is suitable for young and old to learn and take part. There will be lots of hands on experiments to try out, displays to see, plus talks about specific topics relating to our waterways and seas.

In addition we will have a café selling refreshments and various competitions for children to enter.


